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10th Meeting of NRP's Joint Programme Implementation Committee (JPIC)

The 10th Meeting of Joint Programme Implementation Committee (JPIC) for National Resilience Programme (NRP) was held virtually through Zoom on April 06, 2021. Mr. Ranjit Kumar Sen ndc, Additional Secretary, Ministry of Disaster Management and Relief (MoDMR) and National Programme Coordinator (NPC) of NRP chaired the meeting. This meeting, reviewed the activities of the 2nd quarter (April-June) of 2021 and discussed the issues like progress of all the four projects, mid-term review, designing the next phase of NRP, and visibility of NRP. The meeting also emphasised on revision of TAPPs and completion of Joint Programme Evaluation.

Mr. Mohammad Iftekhar Hossain, Programme Coordinator (PC), NRP presented an overview of the NRPs interventions.



All the four subprojects' Project Directors also shared their quarterly progress in the meeting. The meeting expressed its satisfaction over the progress made. However, the meeting expressed its concern about the existing pandemic situation and requested everyone to follow the Covid-19 protocols.

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
Contribution Towards Resilience

Risk-informed and Gender-Responsive Policy Planning

strengthening gender responsive resilient infrastructure through Gender Marker Toolkit




There is strong evidences that gender responsive infrastructures pay long term dividends for advancing gender equality and empowering women. The needs and priorities of women, men and other gender groups are different and infrastructural planning and investments must pay specific attention to consider this as a prime priority. In this Context, Bangladesh Department a Women Affairs (DWA) part of NRP led developing of Gender Marker Toolkit for the Bangladesh Local Government Engineering Department (LGED) with technical support from UN Women and UNOPS. This Gender Marker Toolkit has been designed to strengthen and develop the gender work of LGED with aims to raise awareness, understanding and skills in ensuring gender responsiveness throughout all project stages and for all types of asset. The Toolkit takes the user through 4 Project Stages and 5 sets of Major Indicators were supported by over 90 Key Indicators (KIs).



Generate new knowledge and learning through research

NRP Published a Study Report on Community Resilience in Six Hotspots



National Resilience Programme (NRP)-Programming Division subproject has published a study report on Community Resilience in Six Hotspots. This report served as a background document for the 8th Five Years Plan in identifying community need for disaster risk reduction in the hotspot areas as identified in Bangladesh Delta Plan 2100.


The study recommended for nationwide and hotspot based resilience initiatives which include Upazila based resilience program, resilient housing, and emergency shelter reconstruction, the establishment of agro-based industry in rural and suburban areas, safe housing for coastal and flood affected people, addressing lightning effects, formation of Flood Preparedness Volunteers, etc.




Innovation in Resilience Discourse

Proposed National Recovery Strategy

The earlier concept of recovery has been substituted by the core concept of Build Back Better (BBB) for resilience building. The NRP-DDM subproject provided technical support to GoB for conducting an assessment and developed a National Recovery Strategy in a gender responsive and disability inclusive manner. This strategy will assist to have a common understanding with a sound basis for multi-sectoral engagement and coordinated post-disaster recovery and action. The validation of the Recovery Strategy is now awaiting to be finalised.





Interface between RSDMS, HDM-4, and RDM

Road Deterioration Model (RDM): An Enabler for Asset Management System

Along the ongoing initiatives to establish an Asset Management System in LGED, a Road Deterioration Model (RDM) has also been developed. The RDM will act as an interface between LGED's current 'Road and Structure Database Management System (RSDMS)' and 'Road Deterioration and Works Effects (RDWE) of HDM-4'. It will assist LGED to predict pavement conditions over time and to develop multi-year investment and O&M plans.

Initiatives for Enhancing Capacity

Rapid Gender Analysis Training

NRP-DWA subproject provided technical support to Gender in Humanitarian Action (GiHA) Working Group in organising a 8 weeks long virtual Rapid Gender Analysis (RGA) Training from 20th June to 12th August 2021 for HCTT Cluster members and other NGOs who would potentially be engaged in RGAs in post-disaster situations. The objective of this RGA Training was to increase the pool of country in experts who would contribute RGA experts who would contribute to enhancing Gender Responsive Humanitarian Response Plan. A total of 14 trainees participated in the training. A virtual orientation program of this RGA Training course took place on 20 June 2021, Mr. Ram Chandra Das, Director General,

Training on DIA and DRIP



NRP-PD Part organized a training course on Disaster Impact Assessment (DIA), and Digital Risk Information Platform (DRIP) for GoB officials from 22-24 June 2021 at BICC. Mr. Ranjit Kumar Sen ndc, Additional Secretary, MoDMR, and NPC for NRP was present as the Chief Guest in the inaugural session, and Mr. Khandker Ahsan Hossain, Chief, Programming Division presided over the session.



Mr. Md. Mosharaf Hossain, Additional Secretary, Planning Division was present as Chief Guest in the closing session and awarded certificates to the participants.

In different sessions, the DIA tool and framework were presented by consultants. Several practical sessions for reviewing DPPs from a resilience perspective and implication of DIA in project formulation were conducted. DRIP was introduced to the participants, particularly identifying the risk information using the site and how DRIP can assist in the screening disaster risks in development of projects. In a session, the participants from BWDB, LGED, DOE, and RHD, took part in a dialogue on shairing their agency's experiences for addressing disaster and climate risks.

Training of disaster vulnerable women

NRP-DWA part organized a training on disaster Preparedness, Leadership & Livelihood for vulnerable women.

A total of **28** (out of 2700 targeted women) disaster vulnerable women from Satkhira District attended a 2 days' training in April 2021 for enhancing their knowledge and capacity on economic empowerment and resilience building. With the increased knowledge, they are now expected to respond to and cope up with shocks, stresses effectively. Their leadership, negotiation, and advocacy skills to actively engage in Disaster Risk Reduction and Climate Change Adaptation actions have also been amplified through the training.

FPP refreshers' training on preparedness & response



A total of 1,272 flood preparedness volunteers received refreshers' training to disseminate improved flood early warning to the last mile for better preparedness & response for reducing the loss and damage in June 2021 at 20 UPs in 4 Upazilas of Kurigram and Jamalpur Districts. The volunteers' training will enhance the ability to contribute to the community-led flood preparedness which in terms facilitated the wider scaling up of the adaptation of preparedness activities and early actions based on the forecast.



Training of Trainers' Course on Asset Management

UNOPS and LGED have successfully conducted a three daylong training program for an upcoming pool of Asset Management Trainers at LGED. The training is the part 3 of a four-part "Training of Trainers" program, aimed to build the department's internal capacity to continue and sustain the implementation of capacity building and professional development of LGED staff with a focus on asset management. The training took place on June 15th, 19th, and 21st, virtually, due to current COVID restrictions.

A total of **21** participants (5 female, 16 male) took part in the training. It focused on developing trainers' capacity for effective training delivery using appropriate learning methods/techniques.

TOT on DFRM Model for decentralization

A total of **50** practitioners from GoB and non-government agencies received training on the Dynamic Flood Risk Model for better preparedness and response. The practitioners are now well conversant about the DFRM model. Experts from IWFM of BUET conducted a daylong virtual training for the Govt. and non-govt. officials and FPP volunteers working in Kurigram and Jamalpur. This training was held on June 2021 by zoom platform organized by IWFM with CARE.



Training of Trainers on "Vulnerability Assessment of Earthquake Risk at Ward level, Developing Contingency Plans" for Safe Construction



A total of **82** practitioners (planners, architects, engineers) received training on earthquake-safe construction in Rangpur City Corporation, Tangail/Rangamati/ Sunamganj Pourashavas. They have now improved knowledge and skills to facilitate earthquake-safe constructions. The event was organized by using the Zoom platform, BUET-JIDPUS experts conducted a 3-day long training for civil engineers, architects, urban planners, contractors, firefighters, and volunteers.

She is selling the product into the local market & neighborhood and changed her life.








A total of 35 women from a CSO named "BINDU Women Development organization" at Kaliganj Upazila in Satkhira District are taking action to protect their only drinking water source from contamination of salty water during cyclone YAAS. They successfully repaired the 30 feet broken embankment in 2 days and saved the drinking water source of 15000-20000 people.

Project Activities (April – June 2021)

DIA piloting with three GoB agencies



NRP-PD Part is piloting the Disaster Impact Assessment (DIA) tool & Framework with Bangladesh Water Development Board (BWDB), Roads and Highways Department (RHD) and Public Works Department (PWD). In this connection online meetings were held with the officials of these agencies on 19 & 23 May to discuss the piloting exercise and selection of DPPs. During discussion, the agencies showed interests for piloting DIA tools in selected projects and chief executives of their agencies were informed about the tools and framework for disaster and climate risk screening during project formulation stage.



Fifth Project Steering Committee Meeting



The fifth meeting of the Project Steering Committee (PSC) the NRP of Programming Division part was held on 17 June 2021 at the Planning Commission. Mr. Mohammad Jainul Bari, Secretary, Planning Division, and Chair of PSC presided over the meeting.

The meeting emphasized institutionalizing project interventions to attain sustained benefits. Dr. Nurun Nahar, Project Director presented an overview of the project interventions and proposed a no-cost extension considering the need to complete pending training activities and to implement the MoU with BEZA. The meeting agreed, on principle, for an extension of the project till 30 June 2022 and requested the implementing agency for taking necessary action.


Leaving No One Behind - Gender and Disability Inclusion




Three modules on gender and disability inclusive, Earthquake Preparedness Model and Search and Rescue were developed during the reporting period. Using those modules, a total of 612 people (412 men and 200 women) were trained.

The NRP's partner NGO- Centre for Disability and Development (CDD) designed a disability-friendly resilient housing model at the chronic flood hotspots through an inclusive process.

Innovation in Action - the Flood Preparedness Programme (FPP) Model



As a mean for community response to flood warnings, the DDM part sub-project developed a signaling system under FPP. A disability-inclusive housing model is also being constructed for the flood/erosion-prone areas to contribute to the government resilient housing initiative. **Information Service Centres** at the targeted unions have been orientated on the DFRM to ensure easier and sustainable access to the information generated from the software to the community.



Internalization of FPP with local Government, Administration and DMCs



Upazilla administration, especially the PIOs' offices are engaged in the Early Warning dissemination aligning information in the Government channel with information retrieved through the DFRM model. District Administration and DRROs have also been involved and consulted with maintaining coordination with the Upazilla administration. District administrations are keen and are supportive of the effective piloting of FPP.



Screening of Safe Construction by Building Construction Committees

NRP-DDM subproject facilitated the planning, approval, and construction monitoring by activating the Building Construction committees of various municipality/pourashavas. Urban Community Volunteers (UCVs) in Rangamati assisted Pourashava and district administration to identify landslide risk zones and evacuate at-risk people to safe shelters. They also created awareness on the risk of landslides and campaign on COVID-19. Warning messages were also disseminated through loud hailers/megaphones and billboards.



Lesson learned workshop supported by Department of Women Affairs (DWA)



Department of Women Affairs is implementing a project titled Gender Responsive Disaster Risk Reduction and Resilience (GRDR3) under National Resilience Programme. In order to institutionalize the outcomes of the project, a national level "Lessons Learned Workshop" was held on 9 June 2021 organized by Bangladesh Disaster Preparedness Center (BDPC), supported by the Department of Women Affairs. The participants of the workshop were representatives from the Ministry of Women and Child Affairs, DWA, UN Women, MoDMR, DDM, NRP, CPP, and couple of development partners, including FCDO and Sida, academicians, and other key actors. The programme was chaired by Mr. Ram Chandra Das, Director General, Department of Women Affairs, the recommendations and plan of action from the event will support in paving the way for mainstreaming gender-responsive disaster risk reduction and resilience in the country.

Strengthening Adaptive Social Protection



Five different types of disaster infrastructure schemes (roads, guide walls, box culverts, resilient housing, etc.) have been re/constructed jointly with Employment Generation Programme for the Poorest (EGPP) & Kabita (Cash for Works) using resilience parameters. An estimated, 20,000 people in Kurigram and Jamalpur will be benefited from these infrastructures, especially during the upcoming floods. More importantly, the lessons will be taken forward to make government projects DRR flexible.

Disaster Impact Assessment and Digital Risk Information Platform Sharing Workshop



A workshop to share Disaster Impact Assessment (DIA) and Digital Risk Information Platform (DRIP) tools, developed by National Resilience Programme (NRP)-Programming Division part, was held on 27 June 2021. Mr. Mohammad Jainul Bari, Secretary of Planning Division was present as the Chief Guest in the event. A total of 35 representatives from different ministries and implementing agencies here engaged in the workshop providing valuable feedback to improve these tools further.



Monitoring Guidelines for Disaster Management Committees



In the reporting period, 10 validation workshops on the Monitoring Guideline for Disaster Management Committees were held in 10 upazillas of 5 targeted districts. 248 DMC members, CPP, FPP volunteers, and public representatives participated of which 153 were male and 95 were females. The monitoring guideline was tested during cyclone YAAS by the DMC members of Satkhira and Cox's Bazar. The report on the use of the monitoring guideline is under development.

Asset Management Training Course: Contract Signed between LGED and ESCB

The Local Government Engineering Department (LGED) has signed an agreement with the Engineering Staff College, Bangladesh (ESCB) on 16 June 2021 to provide training to the staff of LGED and other public institutions on asset management. Mr. Md. Jasim Uddin, the Project Director, LGED-NRP, and Mr. Md. Ashraful Alam, Dean, ESCB signed the agreement. Mr. Md. Abdur Rashid Khan, Chief Engineer, LGED was present on the occasion as the Chief Guest. Senior officials from both the sides were also present at the event.

With the technical support of UNOPS, the NRP-LGED subproject has developed the curriculum of the Basic Course on Asset Management meeting the international standards. Alongside, the subproject has developed a pool of trainers who have completed the Asset Management Certification Course of the Institute of Asset Management, UK. The trainers have also received the Training of Trainers (TOT) conducted by UNOPS. In the first phase, a target has been set to train a total of 200 participants, in 10 batches, from LGED and other organizations on asset management.

COVID -19 awareness initiatives

Urban Community Volunteers (UCV), developed through the sub-project, in Rangpur, Tangail, Rangamati, and Sunamganj towns assisted the local administration in conducting COVID - 19 awareness campaign. Volunteers mobilised resources to serve cooked meals amongst low-income groups who faced unprecedented income loss due to the lockdown. Masks were also distributed along with COVID-19 awareness messages.

On the other hand, a total of **235** out of 1,440 Volunteers in the Flood Preparedness Programme (FPP) in Kurigram and Jamalpur assisted the local government & administration in conducting COVID-19 awareness. The volunteers received refreshers training for disseminating the early warning including assisting the community to take early action to reduce the loss and damage from floods.

Management and coordination Approach of NRP

The National Resilience Programme is being implemented following the National Execution Modality (NEX). results framework assigning responsibility implementation to implementing partners and the UN agencies are also included in the governance structure. Each of the four Government Agencies assumes responsibility for the implementation of a set of project activities, known as sub-projects. A of Government project documents (one per sub-project) had been formulated, which sat out the roles, financial allocation, and accountability of all the government cooperating agencies and implementing partners

Governance arrangements

The governance of the National Resilience Programme has been ensured through a two-tier structure:



- Oversight and strategic guidance through a Joint Programme Steering Committee (JPSC);
- A Joint Programme Implementation Committee (JPIC) to support the JPSC

As the lead Government ministry on disaster risk reduction, disaster mainstreaming and implementing the Sendai framework, the Ministry of Disaster Management and Relief appoints the concerned government officials in both tiers.

Management arrangements



Resources are allocated to support programme implementation in two tiers:

- At programme level, through a Programme Coordination and Monitoring Team (PCMT);
- At sub-project level, through the four sub-project Implementation Units.

Young men and women with yellow vests are becoming 'symbol of saviour' among the general mass in urban areas. In the recent months they, as the 'extended force of the city authorities', got engaged in extinguishing fires, rescuing wounded persone treatment, providing foods low-income among the people, alerting people about upcoming hazards and

disseminating COVID-19 awareness messages. In Tangail, during COVID-19 lock-down situations, volunteers served cooked food and masks among the low-income people.

Rangamati Pourashava is surrounded by many hills and lakes. Landslides are common in the monsoon. To avoid such incidents this year, the volunteers started working with the district administration and Pourashava before the monsoon started along with their proactive role in creating COVID-19 awareness. A total of 1500 such urban volunteers 40% are women have been trained through Fire Service and Civil Defence in the four cities to act as the 'first line of defence' for disasters like the earthquake.
