Key Achievements

As a result of organized efforts of sponsoring ministry and UNDP, NRP-DDM Part has contributed significantly in national resilience building. The sub-project has made significant progresses to strengthen the existing government system.

Key accomplishments include the following:

- (i) updated legal and institutional structure of disaster management system through revising Standing Orders on Disaster;
- (ii) sensitized the stakeholders including Parliamentary Standing Committee on MoDMR on Sendai Framework monitoring & reporting system;
- (iii) Customized Sendai indicators for Bangladesh and trained government officials
- (iv) Assessed the national capacity and readiness for dealing mega disaster (i.e., earthquakes) engaging national and international earthquake expert
- (v) motivated GoB for strengthening disability-inclusive, gender-responsive national capacities to address recurrent and mega-disasters and
- (vi) developed a cadre of youth volunteers as the extended force of institutions on (a) earthquake/urban resilience and (b) Flood Preparedness (c) Crisis Preparedness and Management-Mental Health (CPM-MH)
- (vii) Developed a Dynamic Flood Risk Model for being tested in the monsoon.

NRP partnered with several credible entities to develop the above models. Four city authorities with technical support of BUET-JIDPUS and FSCD is for Earthquake Preparedness model, CARE Bangladesh with IWFM of BUET is for FPP model, ESDO is for DRR inclusive Safety Net model and CDD is for Disability Inclusive DRR model.

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Context

Over the years the disaster-related mortality rate of Bangladesh has significantly reduced but economic losses have been increasing very alarmingly and threatening the sustainable development. As it hopes to graduate from Least Developed Country (LDC) category by 2024, Disaster Risk Management (DRM) remains a key priority of the Government of Bangladesh, which is also reflected in its 7th Five Year Plan and various national policies. Considering it as a major obstacle, DRM is being taken to the next level to be a disaster-resilient nation.

The National Resilience Programme (NRP) has been designed to provide strategic support in strengthening national capacity to keep pace with the changing nature of disasters. The goal of the 3 years programme is to sustain the resilience of human and economic development in Bangladesh through inclusive, gender-responsive disaster management and risk-informed development

Key focus of NRP-DDM Part

DDM is one of the four sub-projects of NRP which will strengthen disability-inclusive, gender-responsive national and community capacities to address recurrent and mega-disasters.


