

The National Resilience Programme (NRP) ROAD TO RESILIENCE

At a glance

The National Resilience Programme (NRP) aims to sustain the resilience of human and economic development in Bangladesh through inclusive, gender-responsive disaster management and risk-informed development. It is a joint endeavor by the three UN agencies - UNDP, UNOPS & UN Women, and four ministries - Ministry of Disaster Management and Relief, Ministry of Planning, Ministry of Women and Children Affairs and Ministry of Ministry of Local Government, Rural Development and Co-operatives.

The NRP Department of Disaster Management (DDM) Part develops impactful, replicable, cost-efficient, and gender-responsive models for building resilience, in line with the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction and the Sustainable Development Goals.

















- Developed a 'how to do guide' for Inclusion of DRR elements in the Social Safety Net Programmes
- Trained **960 Urban Community Volunteers** (F 384; M 576) on Earthquake Preparedness.
- Activated 12 ward level disaster management committees in 4 targeted cities.
- Formed 3 Building Construction C 3 cities.

Strengthening National Capacity



- Developed 1440 Community Volunteers (F 576, M 864) under Flood Preparedness Programme
- Prepared Risk Reduction Action Plans (RRAP) in 20 unions using Community Risk Assessments (CRA)
- Introduced 8 Risk informed Social Safety Net schemes in the most vulnerable community; estimated 0000 people in Kurigram and Jamalpur districts getting the benefits of the actions
- Trained 200 extreme poor households (F 114, M 86) on resilient livelihoods
- Trained 632 people on local level disaster preparedness.
- Activated 40 Disaster Management Committees in the targeted Ward, Union and Upazila
- Trained 133 first responders (F 53, M 80) on Disability Inclusive DRR, leadership and advocacy; search
- **14 Public places** including evacuation boats become accessible for persons with disabilities.
- Prepared **6 ward** level Earthquake Contingency Plans for Tangail and Rangapur;
- Provided Search and Rescue Equipment to the 4 targeted cities.
- Reached out 188,696 people with COVID-19 awareness messages through 960 (male-576,
- female-384) Community Volunteers;

Establishment of SFDRR monitoring and reporting system

Facilitated the Sendai indicator reporting against **Target A** (reduce mortality), **B** (reduce number of affected people), **C** (reduce direct economic loss), **D** (reduce damage of critical infrastructures and services) and **E** (enhance national and local DRR strategy) for the period January 2015 to December 2020.



Strengthening Community Capacity



- Developed National Recovery Strategy.
- Identified joint actions on Forecast based early Action .
- Developed a mathematical model Dynamic Flood Risk Model for flood early
- Developed **50 local trainers** on Dynamic Flood Risk Model.
- Refresher training for 1440 Community Volunteers (F 576, M 864) on flood
- Demonstrated 7 risk-informed social safety net schemes; estimated 10000 people will get benefit from those schemes
- Trained 20 Government officials from agriculture, fisheries and livestock department at upazila level on climate resilience adaptation technology.
- An accessible resilient house model is being constructed for the flood/erosion prone
- Prepared 6 ward level earthquake contingency plans for Rangamati and Sunamganj
- Trained **82 GoB officials** on earthquake safe construction as per building codes
- Developed **560 Urban Community Volunteers** (F 224, M 336) on Earthquake
- Provided light Search and Rescue Equipment in 4 targeted cities
- Reached out 350,000 people with COVID-19 awareness messages.
